The story of Horicon Marsh is one of creation, destruction, and revival. Created by the glaciers yet scarred by humans, this important wetland has been restored by conservationists who had the foresight to think about the future of this wetland. Despite the degradation, Horicon Marsh was listed as a Ramsar Wetland of International Importance in 1990 and is one of the best of the best wetlands in the world. Though significantly changed, it is a true testament to the resiliency of nature when allowed to be preserved. Join DNR Wildlife Educator, Liz Herzmann and Wildlife Biologist, Eric Kilburg to learn more about the history and how it impacts present day management and the infrastructure behind a 33,000 acre wetland.



CALVIN CRAMER - OBITUARY



Cal Cramer, a 65 year member of ASABE and emeritus faculty member of UW-Madison Agricultural Engineering passed away at the age of 97 on August 8, 2023. Calvin began teaching at UW-Madison in 1954, as an instructor and joined the faculty in 1959, in the Department of Agricultural Engineering. He taught the design and construction of agricultural buildings, later expanding to courses in the area of construction administration particularly residential construction. He was known by students for having an open office door and a friendly ear who would listen to their questions, concerns, hopes and aspirations. He was voted by the students as the best departmental instructor many times and his colleagues remember him as one who liked to play practical jokes. He retired and was granted emeritus status in 1988. As part of his professional life, he was a member of the American Society of Agricultural and Biological Engineers for over 65 years, and in 1986, he was awarded "Engineer of the Year" by the Wisconsin Section. Fred Buelow, age 94, passed away on August 22, 2023. Fred was a current member of the Wisconsin ASABE section. Fred joined the Agricultural Engineering faculty of Michigan State in 1956. He became an Assistant Dean at MSU in 1966, before coming to the University of Wisconsin in 1967 as Chairman of the Department of Agricultural Engineering. While at Madison, Fred worked with his colleagues to gain professional accreditation for the Agricultural Engineering Department.
