




Richland County is located in Southwest Wisconsin. The county has over 1000 farms, averaging 231 acres each. 57% of the county's gross farm income is milk sales. Other agricultural enterprises include livestock, nursery, and greenhouse crops.

The 2002 Farm Technology Days is co-hosted by the Albert, Ann and Greg Greenheck family & the Randy and Shelly Schmidt family. The Greenhecks operate Cold Spring Registered Holsteins, milking 120 cows in a tie-stall setup. The farm has 950 tillable acres. The Schmidt's milk 480 Holsteins in a double 10 parallel parlor. They operate 2000 acres, with 1250 of those tillable.

Both farms produce alfalfa, soybeans, and corn. The Greenhecks also produce small grains, snap beans and seed corn. Both hosts utilize center pivot irrigation.
